IVINS YOUTH COUNCIL APPLICATION: 2022-2023

The Ivins Youth Council will be held June 2022 - May 2023 and receives guidance and instruction from six Advisors, including an advisor from the Ivins City Council. Membership is limited to no more than 15 high school students who live in Ivins and are currently in 9th - 11th grades (as of March 2022).

The Ivins Youth Council was created by the Ivins City Council to give the youth of the community a voice on city issues, an understanding of how city government works, and an opportunity to provide a service to the community that will showcase the knowledge, skill, and dedication of youth in Ivins.

Some of the activities of the Youth Council: Youth Council Retreat; education on Parliamentary Procedure and Rules of Order; Create a youth event for Heritage Days; make presentations at the Ivins City Council about youth issues; attend the Legislature while in session in Salt Lake; education on City Government; Youth Council graduation. Youth Council members will organize their own events and service projects to promote their Council and give back to the community.

The Ivins Youth Council holds its regular meetings at City Hall on the first and third Wednesday of each month at 5:00 PM. Meetings are scheduled to last one hour. Members are required to attend at least 75% of these meetings and other community and service events.

Members are required to have their own transportation to attend events in Washington County. (Transportation will be provided for the annual Legislative Session trip to Salt Lake City.)

The only out-of-pocket expense Youth Council members will pay for is their own cost for gas for trips within Washington County. There is no cost to members for food and lodging at the annual Legislative session in SLC.

Each member will receive a polo shirt with the Ivins Youth Council logo to wear at all meetings and community events.

Each meeting is vital because the members work with the Mayor and City Council to address local issues important to youth and brainstorm how to improve Ivins for today's youth and future generations. Participation in community service activities is expected.
